



Visual Vocabulary of Systems wins top-tier IIID Award

The Visual Vocabulary of Systems has been awarded a Gold/Distinction* at the International Institute for Information Design (IIID) Awards, held at Design Forum in Vienna, Austria on May 26, 2023. This is the first major prize granted to the SystemViz Project. The award is an important validation of the project for two reasons. First, much of the SystemViz Project involves applying information-design ideas towards improving the interdisciplinary study of systems. Second, the informationdesign community is particularly well qualified to scrutinize the technicalities of the vocabulary's visual schema, as outlined in the syntax specifications. Thus, this nod from design peers is doubly encouraging. An overview of the Visual Vocabulary has been

published in the IIID's award book (the page spread is shown on the left). An exhibition featuring all award winners will go on a 10-country world tour, including to Tokyo, where much of the *Visual Vocabulary* was written. The design community has been the biggest supporter of the project and greater exposure among information designers is a welcome promotional boost.
